

Spartanburg County, used as a cherished hunting ground and buffer zone between the Cherokee and Catawba Native American tribes in the pre-colonial era, was officially founded in 1785. Early European settlers included French fur trappers, English woodsmen, and Scots-Irish farmers. Spartanburg County saw a substantial amount of American Revolution skirmishes and retained a prominent role in United States war history by training servicemen for both World Wars at Camps Wadsworth and Croft. Like much of the South, Spartanburg County's economy and politics were dominated largely by King Cotton as evidenced by vast areas of dedicated farmland and numerous mills built along the banks of the region's rapidly descending streams and rivers. You will experience the legacy left by these various historical components as you complete Spartanburg County's first geotrail!



Spartanburg County Heritage Geotrail

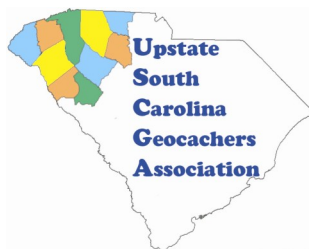
